You can then pay the balance in as many instalments as you wish and for any amount, however all fees must be paid by 31 January 2019 for undergraduate course, and 20 weeks from commencement of postgraduate courses. When you login to https://epay.iadt.ie/invoice the current balance will display on screen. You can simply overwrite this figure with the amount you wish to pay in that transaction. Please be aware, it can take at least 1 working day for the balance to update following an online payment.
