Important Information + Frequently Asked Questions



Please see important information below regarding Autumn Exam/Assessments 2020. This is vital information and quite detailed so do take the time to read them through carefully.

MAKE SURE YOU CAN ACCESS YOUR STUDENT EMAIL AND RESET YOUR PASSWORD IF NEEDED

When are the Results Issued?

The Autumn results will be issued online on **Tuesday 14 September 2021 on or before 2.00 pm**

How do I access my Results?

- Log onto www.iadt.ie
- On the left-hand side of the page, click on **Quicklinks** and choose **Student Self Service** from the choice of boxes
- Enter your student number as your **User ID**, ie N00123456
- Your **PIN** (Personal Identification Number) is the same one included in the reminder email sent out to your student email account
- Click **Login**
- Click on **Faculty Services**
- Click on **Student Services**
- Click on **Final Grades Page**
- The term **2020/21** should be selected – click **Submit**
- Scroll down to view your results
- When you're viewing the results, look for the letters AR beside the modules – this denotes it was an Autumn repeat

What do my Grades mean?

You have PASSED IF

- You have **NO** F, NP, I, IS, IA, W, FL or D grades and your Academic Standing/Award Class is PS, M2, M1, DT, 22, 21, H2 or H1
- Grade DP means that you have **passed** a D grade by compensation (there is no requirement for you to repeat a DP grade)
- Your Award Class is only calculated on completion of a programme

You have NOT PASSED IF

- You have **ANY** F, NP, I, IS, IA, W or D grades (not DP) and your Academic Standing/ Award Class is EX, DE, FL, AB, WH, WD or EB
- If you have any of these grades, you will receive an email (to your student email) on how you need to repeat, as agreed by the Exam Board

EX beside a Grade or Exemptions Granted Academic Standing

- EX beside a grade means you have passed the module and you do not have to repeat it
- Exemptions Granted means that you are exempted from repeating those specific modules passed

How do I Repeat?

- Students cannot progress to the next stage of their programme unless they have achieved all 60 credits per year
- If you have to repeat modules, the Exam Board will have made the decision on the mode of repeat. There are three modes that can be offered by the Exam Board, and these are decided on a case by case basis.

Repeat with Attendance	This is where the student repeats the module(s) failed, with attendance, in the following academic year. There is a charge for this – see the section How much does it cost to Repeat?
Repeat as an External Student	This is where students repeat the module and assessment but do NOT attend classes – this is offered in exceptional circumstances only
Progress with Credit Deficit	This is only offered in exceptional circumstances where a student has failed 10 or less credits but is believed to be able to carry these into the following year, alongside their annual 60 credits. This is not offered to all students.

- Depending on the decision of the Exam Board, you will be registered for one of these options.
- You will be informed via email to your student email account what the decision of the Exam Board was in your case and in what way you have been requested to repeat

How much does it cost to Repeat?

- The fees for repeating will be dependent on the mode of repeat.

Repeat with Attendance	The pro rata cost of this repeat will be dependent on the number of credits you wish to repeat. The fees for undergraduate programmes in 2021/22 currently stand at €3,819. To work out the fees for your number of credits, simply divide the fee figure by 60 and multiply by the number of credits you are undertaking
Repeat as an External Student	Each module repeat will incur a €25 fee
Progress with Credit Deficit	Each module repeat will incur a €25 fee as well as your normal fee for that academic year

What if I want to Appeal?

- You can appeal the grades of the Exam Board
- The Autumn Appeals date is **Monday 20 September 2021 at 4.00 pm**
- Please click on <http://www.iadt.ie/study/current-student-info/appeal-of-assessment-result> for information on how to appeal and appeal forms. Completed forms should be emailed to margaret.murray@iadt.ie on or before the deadline – please include any supporting documentation, ie doctor’s certs etc and ensure you pay the fee
- There is a fee for an appeal, €25 per module up to a maximum of €100. This fee is refunded to you should your appeal be upheld.

What if I still have Outstanding Fees?

- For students with outstanding fees, you will not be allowed to register for 2021/22, even if you have passed all your modules. This means you cannot sit in class, attend lecturers etc. You cannot progress with your studies until you clear your fees in full
- Repeat students will not be registered for repeats with attendance in 2021/22 and will not be allowed to attend any classes
- Students who are in their final year and have passed will not be invited to attend the Conferring until their fee is paid in full; you will receive further information prior to the Conferring about this
- No transcript or parchment will be issued for any student who owes fees until such time as those fees are fully cleared

What if I have Deferred a Module(s)?

- If you have received an I or IS grade (denoting deferral) for any modules, Academic + Student Affairs will register you for these deferred modules onto the 2021/22 academic year. There may be a charge for these modules, depending on the basis on which you were granted a deferral.
- If you have already deferred the 2021/22 year, you will be noted as deferred for the full year

I’ve received a Confirmation Letter – what does this mean?

- If you have received a Confirmation Letter, this means that you have failed a large portion of your programme and it is unclear to the Exam Board or the Faculty whether you wish to continue your studies with IADT
- You will be required to confirm if you wish to continue your studies with us by 30 October 2021. If you haven’t confirmed your intent to return, you will then be withdrawn from your programme.
- If you have confirmed your intent to return, you will either be able to sit for repeat projects/online exams (where these are available) or repeat all failed

modules, with attendance, in 2021/22. Please note that repeating modules incurs a fee, see section above **How much does it cost to Repeat?**

Commencement Dates for 2020/21

- Returning students will commence on **13 September 2021**
- For those who are repeating one or more modules, but not the full year, please contact your Faculty Office as to your date(s) of attendance

Conferring 2020

- If you have completed a Special Purpose Certificate programme, your parchment will be posted to you in November (no conferring ceremony)
- The date for the Conferring is 12 November 2021. Details on the event will be emailed out all relevant students. At the time of writing, there is no decision on whether the event will be held in the RDS or online. All those due to graduate this year will be emailed with further information and the website will be updated as soon as details are confirmed
- If you are outstanding payment of fees, you will not be able to attend the Conferring until such time as the fees are paid in full, nor can you receive your transcript or parchment until such time as the fees are paid in full. Please note that NO payment will be accepted at the event itself
