7. Governing Body Resolutions

7.1 The Governing Body approves the IADT Protected Disclosures Policy 2024 (9/2024)

appointed to the Committee with a view to addressing the gender imbalance within the Recruitment and Selection Committee.

The Terms of Reference for the EDI Committee have been updated to allow for the EDI Committee to undertake an annual Effectiveness Review of the Committee, and to appoint the External Member of the Committee for a 4-year term of office bringing this appointment in line with the terms of office of external members appointed to other Committees of the Governing Body.

7.10 The Governing Body authorises the Chairperson to sign the Performance Agreement with the HEA on behalf of the Institute (18/2024)

Dr Daithí Mac Sithigh – Director of Strategic Projects – was in attendance for this item. Dr Mac Sithigh gave a presentation providing a background and overview in relation to the development of IADT’s Strategic Performance Framework Agreement (the Performance Agreement) in consultation with the HEA. It was noted that the development and agreement of Performance Agreements with the HEA has been set out in legislation through the HEA Act. Circulation of a number of supporting documents in relation to this item was noted by the Governing Body.

The HEA’s formal review of the performance of each HEI under its remit, has been put onto a formal cyclic schedule commencing this year. The development and agreement of IADT’s Performance Agreement with the HEA has been ongoing over the past number of months with the HEA having now authorised the President to present the Performance Agreement to the Governing Body for signature by the Chairperson. Through the development of the Performance Agreement, a number of Performance Objectives have been identified and agreed between IADT and the HEA. Progress reports on the impact of these Performance Objectives will be reported on with evidence-based data through a prescribed template to allow the HEA to achieve consistency in relation to delivering key national pillars across the sector. A number of benchmarks are also being agreed with the HEA against which IADT’s performance in delivering the agreed objectives can be measured. A query was raised in relation to the potential financial impact of failure to meet any of the Performance Objectives. The HEA Act put in place significant monitoring and reporting powers for the HEA for any institution under its remit where there are issues of governance, financial issues or under-reporting, and allows the HEA to impose financial penalties on underperforming HEIs.

The Governing Body welcomed the inclusion of Sustainability as a core pillar within the Performance Agreement. In relation to climate action and sustainability reporting, IADT has effective methods of calculating and reporting on energy usage.

However it will be necessary to report across a wide range of climate action and sustainability metrics into the future, and it is intended to put the necessary systems in place – with support from TSAF funding – to assist the Institute in meeting its action and reporting commitments in this area. A tender process is underway for an on-campus canteen services provider; provisions in relation to waste management have been included within the tender brief.

The Performance Agreements for all HEIs under the remit of the HEA will be published by the HEA and publicly available. In relation to the EDI Pillar within the Performance Agreement, the role of the Athena Swan Charter in guiding institutional activity in relation to EDI was highlighted. In relation to Access, IADT engages closely with DEIS-designated school local to the Institute, to encourage more students to consider participating in third-level programmes. Regular updates will be provided by the President on progress in achieving actions outlined within the Performance Agreement. Research-related metrics in relation to numbers of research-active staff have been included in the Performance Agreement, with the President noting that the Head of Research has processes in place to ensure that all of IADT's research-active staff are included within these metrics.

7.11 The Governing Body Approves <Name(s) Redacted> to be made an Honorary Fellow of IADT (19/2024)

Following a call for nominations issued to staff earlier in the year, nominations to be considered for the award of Honorary Fellow of IADT were received. A meeting of the Honorary Fellow Nominations Committee was held on 9th September at which a recommendation that an Honorary Fellow of IADT should be conferred on two individuals, was made to the Governing Body. The President outlined to the Governing Body the criteria on which the recommendation of the nominees to be Honorary Fellows were made, and noted to the Governing Body that the outcome of this process remains confidential to the Governing Body pending announcement of the Honorary Fellows at the conferring ceremony in November. Regrettably, it was noted that all nominations received were male; the need to work to achieve a wider field of nominations from all genders was highlighted.

8. Governing Body Committees and Academic Council

8.1 Academic Council – Minutes of the Meeting of 13th May 2024

Circulation of the Minutes of the Academic Council meeting of 13th May 2024 was noted by the Governing Body. An overview of matters discussed by Academic Council was given by the President. Recent changes to bus routes servicing Kill Avenue which have been implemented over the last number of months have resulted in anxiety among the student body. Work has been undertaken by the Registrar which has identified that although fewer buses service 'Kill Avenue', a greater number of buses service routes within a short walking distance of IADT. A report on this was provided to Academic Council and information on bus routes has been promoted to students and potential applicants. Academic Council has

welcomed the development of the Memorandum of Agreement with Maynooth University. Funding has been received to support the delivery of new postgraduate programmes through the FilmEU. QQI has confirmed its support for the validation of the Joint BA in Film, which will be delivered through FilmEU providing an additional quality endorsement for students who will undertake the programme. Academic Council received a formal update from the Student Union, providing information on matters important to the student body. Funding has been received to support the development and implementation of a programme designed specifically for students with intellectual disabilities.

8.2 Recruitment and Selection Committee – Minutes of the Meeting of 26th March 2024, 18th June 2024, and Summary Report of the meeting of 30th August 2024

Circulation of the Minutes of the Recruitment and Selection Committee meetings of 26th March 2024, 18th June 2024, and Summary Report of the meeting of 30th August 2024 were noted by the Governing Body.

8.3 Recruitment and Selection Committee – Annual Report 2023/2024

Circulation of the Recruitment and Selection Committee Annual Report 2023/2024 was noted by the Governing Body.

9. President's Briefing

Circulation of the President's Briefing to Governing Body was noted and a number of key points from the Briefing were highlighted by the President.

9.1 National Strategic Update

- **Sectoral Advocacy Group** – the Presidents of all HEIs within the Technological Higher Education Sector have committed to being members of a new Sectoral Advocacy Group once formed. The HEA has given a commitment to provide funding through the Technological Sector Advancement Fund to support the establishment of a new Sectoral Advocacy Group, which it is hoped will be approved by the Board of the HEA shortly.
- **Meeting with An Taoiseach and the Minister for FHERIS** – Presidents from the Technological Higher Education Sector and the University Sector met with An Taoiseach and the Minister for FHERIS on 22nd August last. The President provided a brief overview of key matters discussed at the meeting. The need for all HEIs to ensure the highest levels of governance and an increased level of accountability for funding allocations made to HEIs were among the key messages conveyed to attendees at the meeting. It is anticipated that an announcement of potential funding through the national Training Fund will be made shortly, with projects submissions requiring a collaboration between Higher Education, Further Education and Industry Partners.
- **Staffing Update** – Dr Josephine Browne has now retired from her role as Head of Faculty of Enterprise and Humanities. A recruitment process for a new Head of Faculty will be commenced shortly. The President noted that the two vacant executive posts resulting from the retirement of Dr Josephine Browne and the resignation of Emma Leahy over the summer, has resulted in a gender imbalance within the Executive leadership team. To address this, the HR Manager, Assistant Registrar and Head of Research will be in attendance as contributing members to the Executive Management Team pending the recruitment of the two additional Executive posts.
- **Nominations to Education and Training Boards** – HEIs within the Technological Higher Education Sector were recently invited to propose members of staff from their Institution to be considered for appointment to the Boards of local ETBs. Following the nomination process, the President notified the Governing Body that IADT's EDI Manager Claire McGing has been appointed to the Board of the Dublin and Dún Laoghaire Education and Training Board, Student Services Manager Denise McMorrow has been

appointed to City of Dublin Education and Training Board, and Governing Body member Anne Ferris has been appointed to the Kildare/Wicklow Education and Training Board.

- **Semesterisation** – over the summer the necessary updates were made to the Banner Student Records System to prepare Banner to operate a semesterised model of programme delivery. This was a significant body of work undertaken by staff within the Office of Academic and Student Affairs. The implementation of a semesterised programme delivery model will provide additional flexibility for student and staff mobilities.
- **Digital Media Building** – construction works are nearing completion on the Digital Media Building. The process of fit-out within the building is getting underway and it has been confirmed that the handover of the building will not be until January 2025. However access to the building has been negotiated for the purposes of ICT and canteen equipment fit-out from December. It is hoped to organise a tour of the new building for members of the Governing Body later this year.
- **Quadrangle Refurbishment Project** – the President and the Capital Developments manager have attended a meeting with the HEA and have received a briefing on the next phase of the application process for the Quadrangle refurbishment submission. This will include a detailed economic justification for the project, and detailed environmental impact report.
- **CAO Update** – the CAO Offer/Acceptance processes are currently underway, and the President provided an update to the Governing Body on progress in filling the 615 places available on 1st year of undergraduate programmes. IADT's programme profile has changed slightly this year with some programmes having been retired and three new programmes being offered for the first time. Although the programmes new to market have done well in their first year of recruitment, they will need time to build knowledge of the programme to attract more applicants.
- **HEA Fund for Teaching and Learning** – the HEA has appointed four key advisors to work with the HEA in areas of Teaching and Learning. It was noted that IADT's Head of Teaching and Learning Rebecca Roper and Lecturer in Enterprise Dr Sharon McGreevy are among the four advisors seconded to the HEA.
- **Correspondence from the TUI** – the President noted correspondence received from the TUI and briefed the Governing Body regarding points raised within the correspondence.

9.2 Strategy Implementation

- **Review of structures** – IADT's Strategic Plan commits IADT to reviewing our Organisational Structures. This will be a facilitated process commencing shortly. A tender process is underway among consultants approved as part of the Office of Government Procurement Framework, to support the staff and student consultation process to define the new organisational structure to meet the future needs of the Institute. The Governing Body was also notified of a recent motion passed by the local branch of the TUI. The President noted awareness of the recent motion, but stressed the need to ensure that there is no prejudice in relation to the evaluation and outcome of the tender process.

9.3 Risk Management

- **Board Portal** – over the summer, a new Board Portal has been procured and is in the process of being implemented. Members of the Governing Body will be receiving details of how to log-on to the Portal with dissemination of documentation to transfer to the Portal over the coming months.

10. Governing Body Effectiveness Review – Commencement and Outline of Process

The Governing Body was notified that Deloitte has been engaged to support the Governing Body in undertaking a review of its Effectiveness, and will be contacted by Deloitte in the near future to arrange the one-to-one interviews and consultations necessary to complete the effectiveness review.

11. Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Implications

- The appointment of the three Ministerial nominees to the Governing Body was welcomed, and provides capacity to ensure a full gender balance within both the Governing Body and all Committees of the Governing Body.
- The implementation of a Semesterised model of programme delivery will provide additional opportunities for staff and students to avail of Erasmus Mobilities.
- Arrangements to ensure a gender balance within the Executive Management Team were outlined to the Governing Body.
- The appointment of an external member to the EDI Committee has been approved by the Governing Body, along with approval of the updated Terms of Reference for the Committee.
- An updated Protected Disclosures Policy was approved with the Updates made to the Policy being welcomed by the Governing Body.
- The Governing Body was briefed on the supports which have been put in place to ensure that the needs of the Faculty of Enterprise and Humanities are represented at Executive level pending the appointment of a new Head of Faculty of Enterprise and Humanities.
- A briefing from the Student Union on key matters of importance to the Student Body has been provided to the Academic Council.
- IADT nominated a number of staff to be members of the Boards of local ETBs, with the nominations of the Student Experience Manager Denise McMorrow, EDI Manager Claire McGing and Governing Body member Anne Ferris having been selected for appointment.

The next meeting of the Governing Body will take place on 13th November 2024.
