When are the Results Issued?	Results will be available online to all students by 2:00 pm on Wednesday, 18 February 2026. Please bear with us if there are any delays beyond this time.
How do I access my Results?	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1 Log into the Student Self Service page2 Use your MS 365 login details (if you've forgotten your password, please contact support@iadt.ie for assistance).3 Scroll to "Final Grades – Results" and click on this link.4 On the next page, enter your year of study, and your results will be displayed.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• WIN denotes Semester 1 results.• SUM will indicate Semester 2 results.• AUT indicates the Repeat Exam Session. <p>If you have any technical issues, please email support@iadt.ie with your name, student number, and a brief explanation of your problem.</p>
What do my Grades mean?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">– Passed Semester 1: You have passed if you don't have any F, NP, I, IA, IS, W, or FL grades. Your Award Classification will only be calculated upon completion of your full programme, so it will not be shown unless you are finishing your programme at this exam session.– Not Passed: You have not passed if you have any F, NP, I, IA, IS, W, or FL grades. You will be notified via your student email about how to proceed, based on the decisions made by the Semester 1 Exam Board.– Please be aware that if you receive a failing grade for more than 30 credits in any one academic year, you will be required to repeat all failed modules, with attendance, the following academic year. <p>Special Note about D Grades:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">– From the 2025/26 academic year, a D grade may count as either a pass or a fail, depending on your overall GPA. Because your full set of module results won't be available after the Semester 1 Exam Board, your GPA can't be calculated at that point. This means the final decision about whether your D grade is a pass or fail will be made at the Semester 2 Exam Board. <p>EX beside a Grade or Exemptions Granted:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">– EX means you've passed the module and don't need to repeat it.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Exemptions Granted indicates that you are exempt from repeating certain modules, but there may still be other modules to repeat based on your results.
How will I know if I need to Repeat?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Students who need to repeat a module or have deferred modules will receive an email titled "Decision of the Semester 1 Exam Board" to their student email. – This will provide details about the Exam Board's decision regarding your repeat process. – Please ensure that you can access and check your student email regularly.
How do I Repeat?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you have failed any module in Semester 1, you may still continue into Semester 2. – If you've failed any module in either Semester 1 or 2, you may not be able to progress to the next year of your programme unless you've completed all necessary credits, except in exceptional circumstances (decided by the Exam Board on a case-by-case basis). – If you need to repeat a module, you will be automatically registered by Academic + Student Affairs (no need for you to do this yourself). – The mode of repetition (ie repeat project, repeat exam, or repeat with attendance in the following year) will be decided by the Exam Board based on your individual case.
How much does it cost to Repeat?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – €25 per module applies if you're repeating an exam or project, which will be charged to your account when you're registered for the repeat. – For repeats with attendance, the cost depends on the number of credits you need to repeat. The fee for 2025/26 is €3,819 for all Level 7 + 8 programmes. To calculate your fee, divide this amount by 60 and multiply by the number of credits you're repeating.
What if I want to Appeal?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – You can appeal your Semester 1 Exam results. The appeal deadline is Tuesday 24 February 2026, at 4:00 pm. Please note that late appeals will not be processed. – Visit this link for appeal instructions and forms. – Submit your appeal along with supporting documents and the appeal fee (via this payment link) to appeals@iadt.ie by 4:00 pm on 24 February.
What if I still have Outstanding Fees?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you're continuing into Semester 2, the fee payment deadline is 31 January 2026. – If have unpaid fees, please note that if you have outstanding fees: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ You'll be able to access your grades for one week, but a hold will be placed on your account afterward, restricting access to your grades and transcripts. ○ Repeat students will not be registered for repeats with attendance, will not be invited to register and, therefore, can't attend classes for the following year ○ Final-year students who have passed but still owe fees will not be invited to the Conferring ceremony until all fees are settled. ○ No transcripts or parchments will be issued until fees are fully paid. ○ You can pay fees via this link. <p>For fee-related queries, email feesgrants@iadt.ie.</p>

<p>What if I have Deferred a Module(s)?</p>	<p>If you have received an I, an IA or an IS grade for any modules, you will be automatically registered for the deferred modules.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – An I grade means the assessment is deferred to the next academic year. – An IA grade means the assessment is deferred to the Repeat (Autumn) exam or assessment session. – An IS grade means the assessment is deferred to the next available Semester 2 (Summer) exam or assessment session.
<p>I've received a Confirmation Letter – what does this mean?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – If you receive a Confirmation Letter, it indicates that you've failed a significant portion of your first semester and the Exam Board or Faculty needs clarification about your intention to continue your studies at IADT. Please respond by the stated deadline to confirm your decision. – If you confirm your intent to return, you may need to repeat failed modules (either as projects or with attendance in 2026/27). Your department head will provide details about your repeat process.
<p>Spring Conferring 2025</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – The Spring Conferring will take place on 27 March 2026. Details will be sent to all relevant students in mid-February. – If you have outstanding fees, you will not be allowed to attend the Conferring or receive your transcript or parchment until all fees are settled. Please note that fees will not be accepted at the event.
